

Sacrament of Baptism.

The sacrament through which God, in Jesus Christ, makes us His sons and daughters. To prepare for

reception, call Father Edison @ 924-7111.

Sacrament of the Eucharist. The sacrament through which God, like a responsible parent, feeds us, with food from heaven: His Word, and the Body and Blood of Jesus.

- **Weekend Masses:** Saturday at 4:30 PM, Sunday at 8:30, 10:30 AM and 5 PM. **Important Note: The Sunday Obligation resumed on June 5-6, 2021.**
- **Weekday Masses:** Monday-Wednesday, Friday at 8:30 AM.
- For First Holy Communion, call Donna DeJoode at 924-2800 for more info.
- Family members may bring Holy Communion to other family members who are sick and homebound.

Sacrament of Confirmation. The sacrament through which God by the gift of the Holy Spirit strengthens us to give faithful witness to our Catholic Faith. To prepare for reception, call Elizabeth Johnston @ 924-2800.

- Children, older than 7 y/o, and adults who needs to be baptized, receive Communion and/or be Confirmed, call Deacon John @ 924-7111.

Sacrament of Reconciliation. The sacrament through which God's mercy and love, justice and truth heals the wound of human sin. *Generally offered an hour before each Mass.* Please give the priest fifteen minutes before Mass to prepare for Mass.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The sacrament through which Jesus continues to heal the sick among us. Anointing is offered at each Mass on the first weekend of the month. Or call Fr. Edison @ 924-7111 to schedule an anointing.

Sacrament of Marriage. The sacrament through which God calls a man and woman to become visible signs of His Love. Call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111 for more info.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. The sacrament through which the mission Jesus entrusted to the apostles is continued in the Church. To learn more about vocations to the ordained ministry, please call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111.

This Summer, with some staff and parishioners, I am participating in an online conference on the theme, "Will they come back after COVID?: Disaffiliation, Affiliation, and the Liturgy."

As I re-hear reasons given in survey by Catholics who leave the Church, I wonder if Jesus could outweigh every one of these reasons so as to remain in Him and stay as His Church. But to make this happen, we need to re-experience and re-learn from what Jesus at Mass teaches us...

In the Introductory Rites, it is Christ alone who calls us and gathers us. That is why He leads us in the procession. In Christ, we learn the need for forgiveness and reconciliation, hence, the Penitential Rite. In Christ, we find our true joy, which we express in the singing of the Gloria. In Christ, we have the God who listens to our concerns, thus the Collect gathers our prayers.

In the Liturgy of the Word, God seeks both to inform us and transform us with His Word in the Old and New Testaments, and from Jesus through the Gospels. We do not live on bread alone but by every Word that comes from the mouth of God. God's Word is not like human word. God's Word can make us like God. Having received and lived the Word of God, may we then profess our faith in God. May this increasing faith in God bring us to offer Him our petitions.

In the Liturgy of the Eucharist, God reveals His utmost generosity. He not only gives us His Word, God gives us Himself for our food and drink - in the Body and Blood of His Son, Jesus. What God gives us even comes from His gifts to us—bread, wine, material and spiritual blessings, and ourselves, of course. God can always do more with the work of our hands: so the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus, and from mere men and women, God makes us His Church.

And in the Concluding Rites, having encountered and experienced God, we are missioned to go out to the world that the world too may encounter and experience God.

Early would-be disciples left Jesus. Peter, however, saw Jesus as He is, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the Words of eternal life!"


Please include any of these intentions at your daily 3 PM prayer:



Additional Catechists Needed**





The Imitation of Christ. The spiritual classic by Thomas à Kempis, the second most widely read spiritual book after the Bible, has had an astonishing impact on the spiritual lives of countless saints, peasants, and popes for centuries. Even today, the soul-searching words of the fifteenth-century cleric Thomas à Kempis continue to resonate, un-

bounded by time or geography. Drawing on the Bible, the Fathers of the early Church and medieval mysticism, his four-part treatise shrugs off the allure of the material world, blending beauty and bluntness in a supremely spiritual call-to-arms. This beautiful translation by Ronald Knox and Michael Oakley is considered by many teachers, writers, and readers to be the best English translation ever, and one that greatly enhances the life-changing insights of Thomas à Kempis.

Featured Resource

Restless Heart. Filmed in Europe, this first full-length feature movie on St. Augustine uses a historic backdrop to tell the true story of one of the Church's most beloved and well-known saints. Its message of sin, conversion, and redemption is as timely today as it was in the fifth century. It is the story of a gifted man who pursues fame and fortune without a moral compass—and the dramatic changes that occur in his soul when challenging events lead him to see the light of truth. It also chronicles the collapse of the Roman world and how Augustine laid the intellectual foundations of what would later become Europe. Alongside Augustine, the stories of two other great saints, Monica and Ambrose, are also portrayed. **This movie is not rated, but was created with an adult audience in mind.** It may contain intense scenes indicative of the life and times of the saint or character portrayed. We would recommend Parental Guidance and that parents preview it before watching with children.

Utterly Blessed in Jesus Christ

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens, as he chose us in him, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before him.

- Ephesians 1:3-4

Although the Letter to the Ephesians is addressed to a specific early church in Asia Minor, its message is about the Church universal as the Body of Christ, whose head is Jesus. It is a letter that reminds us powerfully that we, the Church, exists for the mission, to continue the work of Jesus in the world.

The opening verses roots our Christian faith in the graciousness of God. It talks about the countless blessings we receive from God, the best of which is His Son, Jesus. These blessings are not just material but also spiritual - our heavenly inheritance. This has all been planned by God from the very beginning. This is how gracious our God is.

In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ, in accord with the favor of his will, for the praise of the glory of his grace that he granted us in the beloved.

- Ephesians 1:5-6

In His graciousness, God adopted us as His sons and daughters through Jesus. Everything that God does, He does through His Son Jesus and His Holy Spirit. On our part, we must do all we can to cooperate and collaborate with Jesus and the Holy Spirit so as to participate in the saving plan of God for us and for the world.

In him we have redemption by his blood, the forgiveness of transgressions, in accord with the riches of his grace that he lavished upon us. In all wisdom and insight, he has made known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth in him as a plan for the fullness of times, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth.

- Ephesians 1:7-10

God's goodness to us is not diminished by our offenses and sins against Him. Our transgressions have won for us the Savior Jesus. As God has overcome our sins through Jesus, we must overcome our sins with help from Jesus.

In him we were also chosen, destined in accord with the purpose of the One who accomplishes all things according to the intention of his will, so that we might exist for the praise of his glory, we who first hoped in Christ.

- Ephesians 1:11-12

Jesus is the Only Begotten Son of the Father. In Him, we become adopted sons and daughters of God. Jesus is our teacher—he shows us how to live as sons and daughters of God. In so doing, we accomplish the will of God for ourselves and for the world. In so doing, we live to glorify God, to praise His glory. To follow Christ means more than walking behind Him. To follow Christ is to learn from Jesus and to imitate Him.
