

Sacrament of Reconciliation. The sacrament through which God's mercy and love, justice and truth heals the wound of human sin. *Generally offered an hour before each Mass*. Please give the priest fifteen minutes before Mass to prepare for Mass.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The sacrament through which Jesus continues to heal the sick among us. Anointing is offered at each Mass on the first weekend of the month. Or call Fr. Edison @ 924-7111 to schedule an anointing.

Sacrament of Marriage. The sacrament through which God calls a man and woman to become visible signs of His Love. Call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111 for more info.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. The sacrament through which the mission Jesus entrusted to the apostles is continued in the Church. To learn more about vocations to the ordained ministry, please call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111.


Children' Liturgy of the Word

tians, we are called to something more, that is, to encounter Jesus and to grow a personal relationship with him.



Let there be light...

Christian Service and the Power of Faith

How long, O Lord? I cry for help but you do not listen! I cry out to you, "Violence!" but you do not intervene. Why do you let me see ruin; why must I look at misery? Then the Lord answered me and said:... For the vision still has its time, presses on to fulfillment, and will not disappoint; if it delays, wait for it, it will surely come, it will not be late. The rash one has no integrity; but the just one, because of his faith, shall live.

- Habakkuk 1:2-3, 2:2-4

What is faith? From Hebrews 11:1, "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen." In other words, faith is the fulfillment of true and good yearnings and the proof provided by God because of our trust in Him. Faith is God's way of seeing to which we are invited to share and take ownership of.

In this reading from Habakkuk, the prophet brings to God's attention his need for divine intervention which seems to not come. There is violence, ruin and misery and they persist. The prophet Habakkuk is essentially affirming the goodness and the power of God but questions why does it take so much time to see it come. That God is the God of goodness, violence, ruin and misery must come to an end, for God must not allow these to persist and He can bring these to an end.

In response, God affirms that the end of violence, ruin and misery is coming. That even if it seemed delayed, it will still surely come at the right time. Why? Because the just deserves justice, and justice meant the restoration of peace, rebirth and happiness. And because the just are willing to put their faith in God, they will see divine justice come.

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." The Lord replied, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey νои." - Luke 17:5-6

In the Gospel reading, we again encounter faith. This time, the disciples asked Jesus to increase their faith. In response, Jesus told them about the power of faith. Were one to have faith even the size of a mustard seed, one would have such power that commanding a tree, by word, to be uprooted, one would actually see the tree uprooting itself!

And Jesus did more. Using the relationship between master and servant, Jesus posed a challenge on every one of his disciples, that is, to carry out his word through and in acts of service. In a subtle way, every disciple is challenged to become like the mulberry tree. As a mulberry tree is commanded to be uprooted, a disciple is commanded to serve.

Is he grateful to that servant because he did what was commanded? So should it be with you. When you have done all you have been commanded, say, We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do.' - Luke 17:9-10

Keep you parish staff in your daily prayers.

A disciple has to be attentive to the faith he or she must place in Jesus. Equally, a disciples has to be attentive to the faith that Jesus places in him or her.

This Sunday, we focus on a special ministry of service in the Catholic Church, which is the deaconate. Deacons are to become sacramental signs to the Church and to the world of Jesus Christ who came "to serve and not to be served." As ministers of the Word, deacons proclaim the Gospel, preach and teach in the name of the Church. As ministers of Sacrament, deacons baptize, lead in prayer, witness marriages and conduct aspects of the funeral rites. And as ministers of Charity, deacons help identify needs in the community and seek to address these needs through works of charity.

In previous years, the deaconate was limited as a transitional stage for those seeking ordination to the priesthood. But the Second Vatican Council authorized the restoration of the deaconate as a permanent order of ministry.
