Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The sacrament through which Jesus continues to heal the sick among us. Anointing is offered at each Mass on the first weekend of the month. Or call Fr. Edison @ 924-7111 to schedule an anointing.

Sacrament of Marriage. The sacrament through which God calls a man and woman to become visible signs of His Love. Call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111 for more info.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. The sacrament through which the mission Jesus entrusted to the apostles is continued in the Church. To learn more about vocations to the ordained ministry, please call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111.






Exodus 90

Let there be light...

Witnesses to Divine Truth

Though darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the Lord shines, and over you appears his glory. Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance. ... Caravans of camels shall cover you, dromedaries of Midian and Ephah; All from Sheba shall come bearing gold and frankincense, and heralding the praises of the Lord.

- Isaiah 60:2-3, 6

To name for Himself the Chosen People God has one particular reason: so that through them, divine revelation or the self-communication of God to the world may unfold in time. In other words, a nation is chosen so that through them, God may reveal Himself to the world and the world may come to know and believe in Him.

At the Christmas Masses, as proclaimed in the opening verses of the Fourth Gospel, John the evangelist offers us great insight into divine reality - that Jesus, from the beginning, was with God and is God. Though Jesus entered history at a particular time and place, he actually existed from the beginning.

And the Second Reading, in the opening verses of the Letter to the Hebrews, we are made aware how God chose His revelation to unfold gradually and progressively in time, for our benefit - that we may be ready when, in time, the fullness of divine relation in Jesus would come.

As bearers of the divine revelation, the Chosen People carry the light not only for themselves but for all nations of the earth. God gave them His light so that the whole world may walk in the very light of God. Gentiles, in properly understanding and appreciating the gift of divine light, would search for it and be shown it, and in gratitude for such gift, would offer gifts of gold and frankincense to God.

...behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage."... The chief priests and scribes said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel."

- Matthew 2:1b-2, 5-6

Today, on the Feast of the Epiphany, we recognize when God removed the veil from the eyes of the Gentiles so that we too may see and encounter God whose coming the Chosen People gave witness to. At the manger scene, two thousand years ago, the magi from the East ushered in the participation of the Gentiles in the story of salvation.

Two things led them to Jesus. First, the star. The magi were learned men. Their studies in fields of sciences, philosophy and religion led them to the Christ. Second, the Word of

God, as prophecy given by the prophets. In the Gospel reading this Sunday, the chief priests and scribes confirmed the resonance between the guidance of star and the prophetic words of Micah, and helped send the magi to Bethlehem.

This Sunday, we are reminded that once we hear and accept the divine revelation, like the faithful of the Chosen People, we are to find ourselves privileged and accountable for such gift. And like the magi, we need to allow our fascination for the natural world and its sciences, philosophies and religions to point us to the greater reality of God.

Faith and reason are both gifts from God, and both allow us better contemplate the love and truth of God. Our Catholic reflection through centuries on faith and reason has enabled us to honor the respective autonomy of faith and reason and acknowledge how they can complement each other.

It will be a valuable use of our time to read and reflect on Saint John Paul II's encyclical, Faith and Reason. In his words, may we see faith and reason as like two wings that allow us to contemplate the truth of God.
