

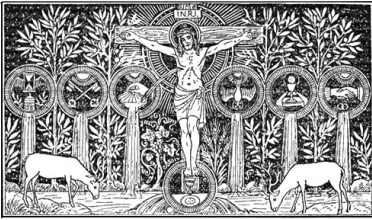

Sacrament of Baptism.

The sacrament through which God, in Jesus Christ, makes us His sons and daughters. To prepare for reception, call Deacon John @ 924-7111.

Sacrament of the Eucharist. The sacrament through which God, like a responsible parent, feeds us, with food from heaven: His Word, and the Body and Blood of Jesus.

- Weekday Masses: Monday - Wednesday, Friday at 8:30 AM, Thursday Communion Service at 8:30 AM

- Holy Communion may be brought to the sick, the homebound, and those in nursing homes and in hospitals. Call the Parish Office @ 924-7111 for more info.

Sacrament of Confirmation. The sacrament through which God by the gift of the Holy Spirit strengthens us to give faithful witness to our Catholic Faith. To prepare for reception, call Mrs. Janet Zazulak @ 924-2800.

- Children, older than 7 y/o, and adults who needs to be baptized, receive Communion and/or be Confirmed, call Deacon John @ 924-7111.

Sacrament of Reconciliation. The sacrament through which God's mercy and love, justice and truth heals the wound of human sin. *Generally offered an hour before each Mass.* Please give the priest fifteen minutes before Mass to prepare for Mass.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The sacrament through which Jesus continues to heal the sick among us. Anointing is offered at each Mass on the first weekend of the month. Or call Fr. Edison @ 924-7111 to schedule an anointing.

Sacrament of Marriage. The sacrament through which God calls a man and woman to become visible signs of His Love. Call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111 for more info.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. The sacrament through which the mission Jesus entrusted to the apostles is continued in the Church. To learn more about vocations to the ordained ministry, please call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111.

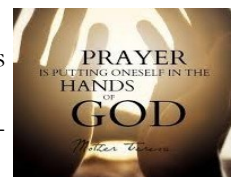

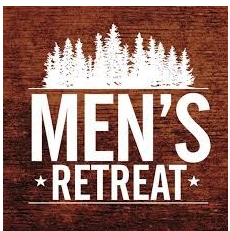

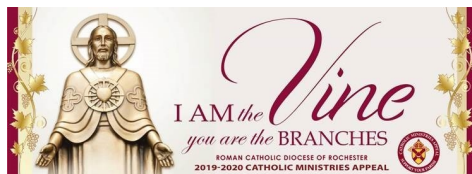

World Day of Migrants and Refugees

Back in 2014, on the second Sunday in ordinary time, we as a Universal Church celebrated the World Day of Migrants and Refugees. His Holiness, Pope Francis wrote a message for the occasion entitled, *"Migrants and Refugees: Towards a Better World."* In it, he recognized that as a world we are learning in an unprecedented way, processes of mutual interdependence and interaction on a global level, filled with problematic and negative elements. He states that *"these processes are aimed at improving the living conditions of the human family, not only economically, but politically and culturally as well. Each individual is a part of humanity and ... shares the hope of a better future."*

In our first reading today, Isaiah says, *"I will make you a light to the nations so that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth."* And Paul's Letter to the Corinthians addresses not only the church of Corinth, but also *"all those everywhere who call upon the name of Jesus Christ, their Lord and ours."* Pope Francis went on to say, *"From the Christian standpoint, the reality of immigration... points to the tension between the beauty of creation, marked by Grace and the Redemption, and the mystery of sin. Solidarity, acceptance, and signs of fraternity and understanding exist side by side with rejection, discrimination, trafficking and exploitation, suffering and death. ... Yet despite the problems, risks, and difficulties to be faced, great numbers of immigrants and refugees continue to be inspired by confidence and hope; in their hearts they long for a better future, not only for themselves, but for their families and those closest to them."* I have to ask; didn't our ancestors do the same... don't we have the same hopes for ourselves and our families and children?

It happened that on the previous Saturday night that year, I spent a few hours with about twenty of our junior and senior high youth, who were on a retreat at Camp Stella Maris for the weekend. Joining them were several refugees from Mary's Place in the city around their same age. These refugees were telling stories about leaving danger and war behind... and coming to a land where food just hung on trees, where we all have three cars, and we have TV's in every room. They came here to escape and to be safer, but they also left friends and family behind, with little hope of ever seeing them again... to start in a land filled with wonder... but also filled with new fears and a new language... yet filled with hope. They came with very little... and were helped by people from the Catholic Family Center and Saints Place. I can tell you that the woman running Saints Place at the time would insist that every refugee would get at least a new pillow and new underwear... and hopefully a new mattress. Everything else could be used. She takes them "shopping" in their warehouse, making sure that they have warm clothes for our winters here, and proper clothing for school. Yet they still live in a city which has dangers and poverty. What our youth group teens gave them was friendship... unprejudiced, a-political, color-blind, and without an agenda... just someone to laugh with and sing and dance and play with... and to pray with... and our teens did it well.

Pope Francis continued, *"We ourselves need to see, and then enable others to see, that immigrants and refugees do not only represent a problem to be solved, but are also brothers and sisters to be welcomed, respected, and loved. They are an occasion that God gives us to help build a more just society, a more perfect democracy, a more united country, a more fraternal world, and a more open Christian community. Immigration opens vistas for the growth of a new humanity foreshadowed in the paschal mystery: a humanity for which every foreign country is a homeland and every homeland is a foreign country."* This vision of universal human solidarity is rooted in the recognition that *"each person bears the mark of the face of Christ."* The human dignity of each individual flows from this recognition... *the fact of being created in God's own image and likeness and, even more so, being children of God.*

I think our children figured it out... we need to follow their lead.
