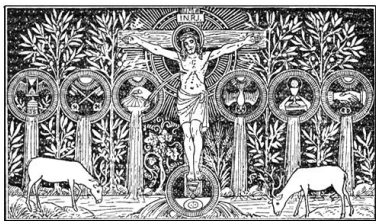

### Sacrament of Baptism.

The sacrament through which God, in Jesus Christ, makes us His sons and daughters. To prepare for reception, call Fr. Edison @ 924-7111.

**Sacrament of the Eucharist.** The sacrament through which God, like a responsible parent, feeds us, with food from heaven: His Word, and the Body and Blood of Jesus.

- Weekday Masses: Monday - Wednesday, Friday at 8:30 AM, Thursday Communion Service at 8:30 AM
- For First Holy Communion, call Donna DeJooode at 924-2800 for more info.
- Holy Communion may be brought to the sick, the homebound, and those in nursing homes and in hospitals. Call the Parish Office @ 924-7111 for more info.

**Sacrament of Confirmation.** The sacrament through which God by the gift of the Holy Spirit strengthens us to give faithful witness to our Catholic Faith. To prepare for reception, call Mrs. Janet Zazulak @ 924-2800.

- Children, older than 7 y/o, and adults who needs to be baptized, receive Communion and/or be Confirmed, call Deacon John @ 924-7111.

**Sacrament of Reconciliation.** The sacrament through which God's mercy and love, justice and truth heals the wound of human sin. *Generally offered an hour before each Mass.* Please give the priest fifteen minutes before Mass to prepare for Mass.

**Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.** The sacrament through which Jesus continues to heal the sick among us. Anointing is offered at each Mass on the first weekend of the month. Or call Fr. Edison @ 924-7111 to schedule an anointing.

**Sacrament of Marriage.** The sacrament through which God calls a man and woman to become visible signs of His Love. Call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111 for more info.

**Sacrament of Holy Orders.** The sacrament through which the mission Jesus entrusted to the apostles is continued in the Church. To learn more about vocations to the ordained ministry, please call Fr. Edison or Deacon John @ 924-7111.

### "Lord, Help Our Unbelief"

The article written by Gregory Smith on August 5, 2019, for the Pew Research Center, entitled "*Just one-third of US Catholics agree with their Church that Eucharist is Body, Blood of Jesus*" reveals to us a serious crisis that should be a cause of great alarm and sadness among us. As many of us have expressed our utter disappointment concerning the clergy sexual abuse crisis, it is this crisis of faith about the Real Presence that is the unparalleled crisis among Christians in our time. It should cause every Catholic to step back and reflect, "*What do I believe about the Eucharist? Does my faith about the Eucharist reflect what Jesus tells his Church about himself?*"

Having heard about this study during homilies in November, it has caused some discussion among parishioners, not excluding the Pastoral Council at the November meeting. Here are some of the remarks. One said, "*I did not know that the Real Presence is what we, Catholics, believe about the Eucharist!*" And another, "*Well, my family prays and expresses our faith in our own way. We do not have to go to Mass.*" And a comment about instructions given at homilies, "*I do not need you to tell me what to do!*" I find these comments diagnostic about what we personally believe. I pray that more discussions on this serious crisis will happen at home, among friends, in ministry meetings, at Coffee Hour, during rides in the car, etc. Our personal beliefs must be compared to the faith of Jesus Christ. A serious discrepancy needs attention and correction.

In the so-called Age of Information, we cannot afford to keep ourselves mal-informed and not informed about the faith that we received from Jesus. Every parishioner is invited to submit questions about the Eucharist / Mass / Real Presence. Let us benefit from revisiting basic tenets of our faith.

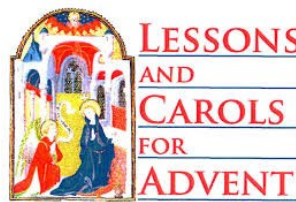

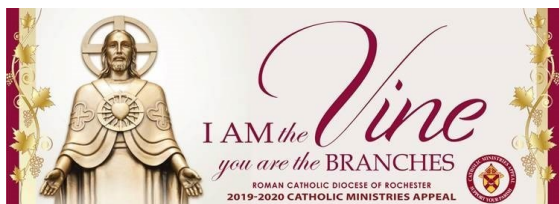

Let there be light...

### God Upholds His Justice

*Not by appearance shall he judge,  
nor by hearsay shall he decide,  
but he shall judge the poor with justice,  
and decide aright for the land's afflicted.  
He shall strike the ruthless with the rod of his mouth,  
and with the breath of his lips he shall slay the wicked.  
Justice shall be the band around his waist,  
and faithfulness a belt upon his hips.*

- Isaiah 11:3b-5

*Judge... rod of his mouth... breath of his lips... justice... faithfulness... no harm or ruin... signal for the nations...*

*Written for our instruction... Scriptures... in keeping with Christ Jesus... one accord... one voice... glorify God...*

*Make straight his paths... produce good fruits as evidence of your repentance...*

Looking at the readings this Second Sunday of Advent, we find 'justice' as their strong and consistent theme. If one were to ask me, "What is justice?" I'd reply with, "Justice is doing what is right, what is in accord to our relationship with God and therefore, in accord to the God-given dignity of each human person."

In the first story of creation, there is insistence on God proclaiming that creation is good. Goodness is the mark of creation, and therefore, must be the ongoing mark of creation. Why? Creation, which includes us, glorifies its Creator when it remains and insists on being good.

Part of God's creation is the relationship that He enters with every man and every woman. Even these relationships, because they are God's, are good and must remain good. In entering into covenant with us, God raises us to a dignity that only He can give. For our benefit, God establishes precepts and provides instructions that will help us *uphold and promote our covenant with Him*. Also, these precepts and instructions *reflect and safeguard the dignity of the human person*. Every time the precepts and instructions are observed, we uphold our relationship with God and neighbor. And every time the precepts and instructions are violated, we disrespect our relationship with God and neighbor.

Salvation history, as we see it unfold in the Scriptures, is the story of human transgression of our covenant with God and of God re-establishing our covenant with Him to the point of sending His Son, Jesus, to us, to the point of His Son, Jesus dying on the Cross on our behalf. God chose to die on our behalf! God does not desire any harm nor ruin on us but demands from us one accord and one voice that is in keeping with Jesus Christ. Why Jesus? Because every Adam and every Eve failed in living out our proper sonship in God. Only Jesus has succeeded in living out a relationship with God that is attentive to the spirit and the word of God.

Hear the pain and anguish of Jesus, in the Gospel, as he addressed the Pharisees and Sadducees, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance. And do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you, God can raise up children to Abraham from these stones."

What is the grave mistake of the Pharisees and Sadducees? They entered a relationship with God but by name only.
