





- 63 respondents represent ~10% of active members and a small percentage of registered parishioners.
- 97% of the respondents attend Mass every Sunday.




- Most respondents find respect and reverence at Mass.
- No obvious correlation to age and sex. Under 40 average answer: Agree (3.7)

Over 40 average answer: Agree (3.9)
Male average answer: Agree (3.7)

Female Average answer: Agree (3.8)


(A score of 2.5 would be neutral.)




- 35 respondents feel they would benefit from more reverence at mass.
- 10 feel the current level of reverence is adequate.
- 18 were neutral.
- No obvious correlation to age or sex

## **Results of the Respect and Reverence Survey**

I. Statistical Analysis and Overview





- 39 respondents have experience with the Extraordinary Form of the Mass (Latin Mass).
- Surprisingly, there is a correlation to age: many of the young respondents have experience of the Latin Mass.
- Over 40 years: Agree (3.4)
- Under 40 years: Strongly Agree (4.2)
- 29 respondents were favorable toward occasionally offering the Extraordinary Form of the Mass.
- 18 were not favorable, some quite strongly.
- 8 were neutral.
- The young responders swayed correlation to favorable.

Over 40 years: Neutral-Agree (3.2) Under 40 years: Agree (4.2)

## Synopsis of comments in order of frequency:

- Personal Change / Dress. Many believe our own behaviors determine reverence. 8
- 6 Don't know.
- Adult Catechesis. More understanding of the Mass is needed. 6

- Music. Sing together more. Use songs that we know. 6
- 5 Less talking before and after Mass.
- 4 Briefly pray together after Mass.
- 3 People should be on time for Mass. Late arrivals disturb others.
- 3 Play soft and classical Music. Less singing.
- 3 Latin Mass is not superior; reject it.
- 3 Use Family Room for children. Provide childcare.
- The use of Latin will promote reverence. 2
- 2 No change.
- 2 Preach on Sunday Obligation.
- 2 Bring back the Communion rail.
- 2 Fr. Edison displays reverence already.
- 2 Use incense.
- 2 No non-Mass-related announcements before or after Mass.
- Prefers Gregorian Chant. 1
- 1 Does not like Gregorian Chant.
